Overview

Cibolo Health is a healthcare organization dedicated to strengthening rural and independent healthcare systems across the United States. By partnering with local hospitals and clinics, Cibolo Health builds statewide, clinically integrated High Value Networks (HVN) that improve care quality, reduce costs, and preserve patient access. The model allows independent providers to maintain local governance while gaining the benefits of scale, shared infrastructure, and collaborative innovation.

Organization Snapshot

- **Mission:** To build scalable infrastructure that enables independent rural hospitals to improve care coordination, strengthen financial sustainability, and succeed in value-based healthcare.
- **Network Scale:** Connects more than 200 hospitals and clinics across multiple states.
- **Patient Reach:** Serves approximately 9.7 million patients.
- **Economic Footprint:** Represents a combined network revenue footprint of roughly \$20.3 billion.

The High Value Network (HVN) Model

Cibolo Health helps independent rural hospitals form collaborative networks to share critical resources and expertise that would be difficult or cost-prohibitive to develop alone.

Key Components of the HVN Model:

- **Shared Infrastructure:** Provides access to centralized care coordination, population health analytics, telehealth platforms, and IT services.
- **Clinical Integration:** Facilitates the exchange of clinical best practices and standardized quality improvement initiatives to ensure consistent, high-quality care.
- **Preservation of Independence:** Allows member hospitals to remain locally owned and operated, keeping decision-making within the community.
- **Value-Based Readiness:** Equips rural providers with the tools and scale needed to participate in and succeed under value-based payment models, such as Medicare Shared Savings Program (MSSP) Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs).

Measurable Outcomes & Impact

The collaborative HVN model delivers quantifiable improvements in clinical quality, patient experience, and financial performance.

Reported Results from Network Members:

- **Reduced Hospital Readmissions:** Avoidable readmissions in one member hospital fell from 16.5% to less than 5% through improved care coordination.
- **Lower Emergency Department (ED) Use:** Proactive care management led to 536 fewer ED visits annually in a single network, avoiding an estimated \$1.13 million in costs.
- **Improved Quality Performance:** Participating facilities have demonstrated a 22.89% average improvement in key quality measures for chronic disease and preventive care.
- **Enhanced Local Care:** Increased repatriation rates allow patients to return to their local providers for follow-up care, keeping services close to home.
